ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLE I

NAME

1.01 Name

The name of this corporation shall be Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society. The business of the corporation may be conducted as Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society or LAMPS.

ARTICLE II

DURATION

2.01 Duration

The period of duration of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSE

3.01 Purpose

Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society is a non-profit corporation and shall operate exclusively for educational and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future Federal tax code. Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society's purpose is to provide free community arts experiences and to raise funds for local charities and non-profit organizations.

Sample Purpose in Detail: We produce admission-free, outdoor concerts with support from local donors. These concerts are also fundraisers for local non-profits and charities. For example, we solicit funding and donations in kind from local business owners to help fund our concerts and for distribution to local non-profits and charities. We also solicit donations from the general public during the concerts we produce for distribution among local non-profits and charities. We also utilize electronic and print media to solicit funds for distribution among local non-profits and charities.

Our programs include producing a monthly outdoor concert in Lubec, Maine to raise awareness about non-profits and charities operating in and around the Lubec, Machias and Eastport, Maine areas. The concerts are also fundraising events for said non-profit and charity groups. The concerts also provide a free community arts experience and

information regarding local non-profits and charities.

In order to maximize our impact, we may also partner with donors to offset the costs of producing these concerts. We may also partner with other non-profit organizations which fall under the 501(c)(3) section of the Internal Revenue Code and are operated exclusively for charitable purposes.

At times, in order to have a greater impact on our goals and more positive outcomes for the community, per the discretion of the board of directors, LAMPS may provide opportunities for members to assume volunteer positions which will include involvement in aforementioned activities and programs.

3.02 Public Benefit

Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society is designated as a public benefit corporation.

ARTICLE IV

NON-PROFIT NATURE

4.01 Non-profit Nature

Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society is organized exclusively for educational and charitable purposes including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code. No part of the net earnings of Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by any organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society is not organized and shall not be operated for the private gain of any person. The property of the corporation is irrevocably dedicated to its charitable purposes. No part of the assets, receipts, or net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to any individual. The corporation may, however, pay reasonable compensation for services rendered, and make other payments and distributions consistent with these articles.

4.02 Personal Liability

No officer or director of this corporation shall be personally liable for the debts or obligations of Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society of any nature whatsoever, nor shall any of the property or assets of the officers or directors be subject to the payment of the debts or obligations of this corporation.

4.03 Dissolution

Upon termination or dissolution of the Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society, any assets lawfully available for distribution shall be distributed to one (1) or more qualifying organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or described in any corresponding provision of any successor statute) which have a charitable purpose which, at least generally, includes a purpose similar to the terminating or dissolving corporation.

The organization to receive the assets of the Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society hereunder shall be selected by the discretion of a majority of the managing body of the Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society and if its members cannot so agree, then the recipient organization shall be selected pursuant to a verified petition in equity filed in a court of proper jurisdiction against the Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society by one (1) or more of its managing body which verified petition shall contain such statements as reasonably indicate the applicability of this section. The court upon finding that this section is applicable shall select the qualifying organization or organizations to receive the assets to be distributed, giving preference if practicable to organizations located within the State of Maine.

In the event that the court shall find that this section is applicable but that there is no qualifying organization known to it which has charitable purpose, which, at least generally, includes a purpose similar to this corporation, then the court shall direct the distribution of it assets lawfully available for distribution to the Treasurer of the State of Maine to added to the general fund.

4.04 Prohibited Distributions

No part of the net earnings, or properties of this corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers or other private person or individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III, Section 3.01.

4.05 Restricted Activities

No substantial part of the corporation's activities shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene (including the publishing or distribution of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate

for public office.

4.06 Prohibited Activities

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (I) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax as an organization described by Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (II) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE V

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

5.01 Governance

Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society shall be governed by its board of directors.

5.02 Initial Directors

The initial directors of the corporation shall be Kurt Andresen, Fred Pierce, Duane Ingalls, Elizabeth Nichols-Goodliff, Emma Page, Meredith Huntley and Tim Pence.

ARTICLE VI

MEMBERSHIP

6.01 General Membership

Lubec Area Musicians' Philanthropic Society shall have a General Membership of volunteers as described in Article III, Section 1. Membership shall be open to any resident of Lubec, Machias, or Eastport Maine, and the adjacent municipalities, that supports the purpose set forth in Article III, Section 1. Volunteers shall be required to complete a volunteer application, which will be subject to approval by the Board of Directors. Volunteers accepted to the Corporation are allowed to participate in the activities of the Corporation as described in Article III, Section 1. Volunteers shall have the right to vote in elections for the Board of Directors at the Corporation's annual meeting. Volunteers shall also have the right to financially support the Corporation.

The management of the affairs of the corporation shall be vested in a board of directors, as defined in the corporation's bylaws.

ARTICLE VII

AMENDMENTS

7.01 Amendments

Any amendments to the Articles of Incorporation may be adopted by approval of four-sevenths (4/7) of the board of directors.
